



### **Campus Overview**

- The campus opened in June 2005 and graduated the first class in June 2006.
- The 225,000-square-foot training facility is located in Norwood, Mass., approximately 25 miles southwest of Boston.
- The school has the capacity to train approximately 2,500 students.
- The key employers in the Boston area that employ UTI-Norwood graduates are Advance Auto, AutoZone, Bernardi Auto Group, Boch Auto Group, Boston Fire Department, Boston Public Works, Bridgestone Firestone Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co., Clay Auto Group, Herb Chambers Auto Group, JP Noonan Transportation, National Tire and Battery, Penske Truck Leasing, Pep Boys, Ryder System, Sears Auto Centers and Woburn Toyota,.
- There are approximately 90 employees at the UTI-Norwood campus and they earn an average wage of about \$60,000 annually, having a nearly \$6.6 million salary impact on Massachusetts and the surrounding states.

### **Specialized Training**

- Universal Technical Institute (UTI-Norwood) provides the training necessary to excel as an entry-level automotive or diesel service technician.

### **Core Programs**

- Automotive – The program teaches students how to diagnose, maintain and repair domestic and foreign automobiles.
- Diesel & Industrial – The program teaches students the basic knowledge and skills to diagnose malfunctions in mechanical and electrical systems and make necessary repairs and replacements on diesel engines, commercial vehicles and heavy equipment.
- Automotive/Diesel & Industrial – The program combines all the courses from the Automotive Technology plus the Diesel & Industrial Program to train students for a career as a professional technician in each of these industries.

### **Manufacturer-Specific Advanced Training (MSAT) Programs**

- Ford Accelerated Credential Training (FACT) – The 15-week program teaches students about the equipment and procedures used in Ford and Lincoln service departments around the nation.
- Nissan Automotive Technician Training (NATT) – The 9-week program provides training to troubleshoot, repair and maintain chassis, climate, drive train, electrical and engine systems for Nissan and Infiniti vehicles.

### **Accreditation**

- UTI-Norwood is accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC), which is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

**STEM**

- Universal Technical Institute participates in the STEM Education Coalition, a nationwide initiative that reflects our commitment to ensure science, technology, engineering and math skills are interwoven throughout our curriculum.
- UTI has been designated a 2016 STEM Jobs Approved College by Victory Media, the leader in helping America’s military veterans transition to civilian life.

- Universal Technical Institute is on the 2016 Military Friendly Schools® list published by Victory Media in recognition of efforts to ensure the success of America's military service members, veterans and spouses as students.

**Community Champions**

- UTI-Norwood employees and their families as well as students are actively involved in the community. Staff and students roll up their sleeves several times each year, and donate more than 375 units of blood to the American Red Cross.
- To date, the campus has hosted two Skills Gap Summit & Expos to raise awareness about the need for greater collaboration between industry and education in creating curriculum that prepares people with the relevant skills needed to achieve employment and bridge the gap in New England's skilled labor force.
- UTI-Norwood was presented with the Large Business of the Year award for 2013 by the Neponset Valley Chamber of Commerce (NVCC), which grants this to a member that demonstrates outstanding achievement in general management, employee relations, business growth, product innovation, and community and social responsibility. In particular, the campus staff and faculty were recognized for their efforts in supporting STEM initiatives in Massachusetts and nationwide, their support of the Chamber's Education and Business Committee, and their positive involvement in the community.
- In June 2013, the campus hosted the Boston Strong Car Meet with 100% of proceeds donated to The One Fund Boston to support the victims and families affected by the bombings at the Boston Marathon. Students and staff participated in this event, which brought together over 800 cars and 1,200 people to the UTI-Norwood campus.
- Employees also participate in many events for our students and community, including PowerPalooza, car shows, career fairs and the Manufacturer Specific Advanced Training Expo.
