Melba Bartels is BECU's executive vice president and chief financial officer (CFO). She oversees all of BECU's financial operations, including finance business support, treasury, accounting, company-wide budgets, tax compliance reporting, financial analysis and a new non-finance enterprise strategic services function, focused on organization-wide execution of strategic initiatives. Melba also manages BECU's relationships with the financial community, including regulators and auditors.

Since joining BECU in 2017, Melba has streamlined internal processes and established a strong, diversified financial division that has not only led to efficiencies across the business, but has allowed for new innovation, which ensures the cooperative is positioned well for sustainable long-term growth. She has brought new sophistication and capabilities in pricing, hedging/capital markets, budgeting, planning, operations, control functions, reporting and more – all to the benefit of BECU's over 2,600 employees and more than 1.3 million members.

Before BECU, Melba served as senior executive vice president and CFO at HomeStreet Bank, where she was responsible for all aspects of financial management. She also spent six years at JPMorgan Chase and held numerous financial leadership positions during 20 years of service at Washington Mutual Bank.
