

Meet the 2019 U.S. Junior Amateur Quarterfinalists

Kelly Chinn, 16, of Great Falls, Va.

- Born May 13, 2003 in Lemoore, Calif.
- No. 903 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 21 seed with rounds of 71-73 in stroke play
- Rallied to defeat Palmer Jackson in 19 holes in the Round of 16
- Medalist and advanced to Round of 32 in last year's U.S. Junior Amateur
- Helped Langley High School win its second consecutive Virginia Class 6A state title
- Class 6A runner-up after winning the individual state crown in 2018
- Chosen to *Washington Post* All-Met first team for the second year in a row
- Won Middle Atlantic Junior PGA in a three-way playoff on July 2
- His father, Colin, is a rear admiral in the U.S. Navy who serves as Joint Staff surgeon at the Pentagon and is the chief medical advisor to the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff

George Duangmanee, 17, of Fairfax, Va.

- Born Nov. 15, 2001 in Fairfax, Va.
- No. 308 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 15 seed with rounds of 70-73 in stroke play
- Posted a 1-up victory over Bronson Myers in the Round of 16
- Played in the championship's longest match (21 holes) in the Round of 64
- Competing in his first USGA championship
- Advanced to the Round of 16 in this year's Virginia State Amateur
- Five top-10 AJGA finishes this year, including the Junior Invitational at Sage Valley (T-10)
- Won five U.S. College Sports Camp (USCC) events in 2019
- In 2017, he won the U.S. Kids Teen Worlds and tied for ninth in the Class 6A state championship
- Claimed 2015 Drive, Chip & Putts Boys 12-13 Division title in a playoff at Augusta National Golf Club

Austin Greaser, 18, of Vandalia, Ohio

- Born Sept. 9, 2000 in Dayton, Ohio
- No. 604 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 19 seed with rounds of 71-73 in stroke play
- Recorded a 6-and-5 victory over Kento Yamawaki in the Round of 16
- Defeated 2018 U.S. Junior Amateur quarterfinalist Thomas Ponder, 1 up, in Round of 32
- Competing in his first USGA championship
- Finished third in the 2018 Ohio Division I state championship and placed fifth in 2017
- Tied for third in both the AJGA's Justin Thomas Junior and Under Armour/Jordan Spieth this year
- Chosen Greater Western Ohio Conference-American Division player of the year
- Will attend the University of North Carolina in the fall of 2019

Bo Jin, 17, of the People's Republic of China

- Born May 21, 2002 in the People's Republic of China
- No. 777 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 8 seed with rounds of 70-71 in stroke play
- Defeated No. 9 seed Brian Ma, 2 up, in the Round of 16
- Reached his first U.S. Junior Amateur as the first alternate from Fresno, Calif., sectional qualifier
- Will meet Deven Ramachandran in the U.S. Junior Amateur quarterfinals; the two previously battled in a sectional qualifier 3-for-1 playoff
- His brother, Cheng, won the 2015 Asia-Pacific Amateur and competed in the 2016 Masters
- Cheng played in three U.S. Amateurs and three U.S. Junior Amateurs
- His sister, Jiarui (Joyce) Jin, has qualified for next week's U.S. Girls' Junior
- Lived in the United States for two-plus years after residing in Beijing and Singapore
- Attends Futures Academy (formerly Halstrom Academy) in Carlsbad, Calif.

Garrett Martin, 18, of San Antonio, Texas

- Born Oct. 27, 2000 in San Antonio, Texas
- No. 931 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 45 seed with rounds of 73-75 in stroke play
- Posted 1-up victories in both the Round of 16 and Round of 32
- Competing in his second U.S. Junior Amateur and last played at The Honors Course in 2016
- Medalist in two USGA qualifiers this year, including a 65 in U.S. Open local qualifying
- His father, Michael, serves as his head coach at Johnson High School
- Tied for ninth in the 2019 Texas 6A state championship and team was fourth
- Two-time *San Antonio Express-News* Golfer of the Year
- Been tutored by 1980 U.S. Amateur champion and 14-time PGA Tour winner Hal Sutton, and PGA Tour winner Cameron Beckman

Joseph Pagdin, 17, of England

- Born Nov. 24, 2001 in England
- No. 41 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 23 seed with rounds of 76-69 in stroke play
- Defeated current Ohio Amateur champion Matthew Moldovan in Round of 16
- Rallied to win his Round-of-32 match over Yuki Moriyama in 19 holes
- Competing in his third U.S. Junior Amateur and also advanced to match play in 2017 (Round of 64) and 2018 (Round of 32)
- Reached match play in the Amateur Championship, conducted by The R&A, in June
- Semifinalist in last year's Boys Amateur and Great Britain and Ireland Boys Team member
- Lived in Florida since age 3 and tied for fourth in this year's Class 3A state championship as a junior at Lake Nona High School
- Practices at Lake Nona G. & C.C. alongside past U.S. Open champions Graeme McDowell (2010) and Justin Rose (2013)

Deven Ramachandran, 18, of San Rafael, Calif.

- Born March 16, 2001 in Newton, Mass.
- Not ranked in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 16 seed with rounds of 73-71 in stroke play
- Defeated No. 33 seed Jacob Sosa, 3 and 2, in the Round of 16
- Competing in his second consecutive U.S. Junior Amateur
- Earned one of two spots in Fresno, Calif., sectional qualifier in a playoff
- Rising sophomore at Seton Hall University
- Tied for 22nd in 2019 Big East Conference Championship
- Carded a season-best 3-under 210 in Princeton Invitational
- Three-time All-Marin County Athletic League first team at The Branson School
- Recorded five top-10 finishes in FCWT junior competition

Preston Summerhays, 16, of Scottsdale, Ariz.

- Born July 22, 2002 in Layton, Utah
- No. 208 in World Amateur Golf Ranking™
- Earned No. 11 seed with rounds of 72-70 in stroke play
- Defeated Akshay Bhatia (No. 4 in the WAGR), 1 up, in the Round of 16
- Edged current Virginia Amateur champion Michael Brennan, 1 up, in the Round of 32
- Competing in his second USGA championship and first U.S. Junior Amateur
- Shot 65-60 in 2018 U.S. Amateur qualifying, the lowest 36-hole sectional score since 2011
- Won his second consecutive Utah State Amateur last week and was the youngest to win the championship (age 15) last year
- Attends Chaparral High School and played in the 2019 Utah Championship on Korn Ferry Tour
- Posted top-10 finishes in the Ping Heather Farr Classic (T-7) and Junior Invitational at Sage Valley (T-10)
- Son of former PGA Tour player Boyd and nephew of current PGA Tour player Daniel
- Great nephew of Bruce, who won three PGA Tour Champions events
