

How To Read the Chart

For example:

- *Players to win the opening hole go on to win the match 60% of the time
- *Players 2-up at the turn go on to win 84% of the time
- *Players 3 down through 3 holes have gone on to win the match 16% of the time
- *Players 1 down with 4 holes to play have won the match 21% of the time, etc.

^{*}The last time Ridgewood hosted a PGA Tour event was the 2018 Northern Trust. That week, players were able to go for the green under regulation (a par five in two or a par four with a drive) just 36.7% of the time, the lowest rate all season on Tour.

*Will performance off the tee prove to be more significant at Ridgewood? Consider this: each of the last four PGA Tour winners at this course had a higher ranking that week in strokes gained off the tee than they did in strokes gained approach.

^{*}In last year's championship match, there was quite a swing in win probability for James Piot from being three down with nine holes to go. Based on historic outcomes in this championship, Piot had just an 8% win probability with nine holes left. He rattled off four consecutive holes won to take the lead, and never looked back.

^{*}The medalist or co-medalist has only reached the round of 16 four times in the last ten years at the U.S. Amateur. The last to do it was Cole Hammer in 2018.
