## **Q. How satisfying was it to make that last par putt?**

Scott Harvey: “That was great. I didn’t need to make it to make match play, obviously. I want to get medalist again. Once you get that close this late in stroke play you want to do it. I still think I needed to get to 6 or 7 [under]. This gives myself an outside chance.”

## **Q. Why is it so important to be medalist?**

Scott Harvey: “It’s not necessarily important but it is something that I started doing years ago. It’s really neat, I like the history of it. Any time your name is associated with any sort of record, it’s pretty cool.”

## **Q. How was your feel today?**

Scott Harvey: “It was way more of a battle. The weather got iffy and I was battling that a little bit. I was definitely not hitting it anything close to yesterday. But I made some good par putts. I missed it in the right spots and got away with a few things.”

## **Q. Does having played in so many Mid-Amateurs show your experience in this situation?**

Scott Harvey: “One hundred percent, especially USGA setups. It’s not like back home where you just blow it up there somewhere and don’t think about it. You have to navigate, think your way around and still execute too.”

**Notes** – Scott Harvey has been the U.S. Mid-Amateur stroke-play medalist a record four times (2010, 2014, 2015, 2016). He has made match play in 13 of 14 Mid-Amateurs played. In today’s second round of stroke play, he made a two-putt birdie on the par-5 15th and then he hit a pitching wedge to within 4 feet to setup another birdie. He sank par putts of 6 and 15 feet on holes 17 and 18, respectively.
