The state's newest winery, Point Lookout Vineyards, offers sweeping views of the Blue Ridge Mountains from an elevation of nearly 3,000 ft. on Point Lookout Mountain. The centerpiece of the winery is a 4,000-square-foot open-air pavilion that serves as both a tasting room and event space. The Pavilion is crafted from hand-hewn cedar

logs from British Columbia and includes an additional tasting room, kitchen and dressing suites. The winery offers a selection of 10 dry and semi-sweet wines crafted from such grapes as Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Riesling.

50 Years for Carl Sandburg Home in NPS

Fifty years ago this October, the home of the late poet Carl Sandburg became an official part of the National Park Service. The historic estate, named Connemara by its original owner, was where Sandburg spent his last two decades. He wrote a third of his life's works there and won his second Pulitzer while living there. The home is open every day but Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. It houses more than 10,000 books and manuscripts. Also popular are the estate's



goats, descendants of Lilian Sandburg's herd of world champion dairy goats.

Hendersonville, a long-time leader in apple production, now leads the way in hard cider. The mountain town is home to three cideries, Bold Rock, Appalachian Ridge and Flat Rock Ciderworks. Bold Rock has a state-of-the-art tasting room and production facility in Mills River, while Appalachian Ridge operates out of a refurbished 1940's barn in the midst of an apple orchard.
